

Screencasting Tools

Screencasting for adult educators

Screencasting is a means of creating videos as an aid to help others. A screencast is a digital recording of a screen, often containing audio narration. This type of tool is great for:

- A learner-centered approach to learning
- Teacher to Teacher learning
- Teacher as facilitator

Screencast-O-Matic is a popular, free tool used to create screencasts. Educators and learners can use Screencast-O-Matic for easy screen recording and video editing.

A flipped classroom is where students are introduced to a topic at home, and time spent in the classroom is focused on understanding the content.

Videos can be used in the classroom for flipped learning, learner assignments, two-way mentorship and more! Screencast O Matic is a well-designed and easy to use tool that can allow the creation of engaging content.

WordPress is a tool primarily used by individuals and organizations for blogging, but it can also be used to create websites. Wordpress has a large array of third-party plugins, allowing Wordpress to be used with many other tools and offers consistent usage between mobile and computer browsing.

For educational purposes, WordPresss can be used to create a class blog or website which can provide links to resources for students. Post daily tasks, information of what was covered in a lesson, or even post when assignments are due. Wordpress can also be used to showcase a user's work, perfect for students to showcase what they have learnt.

TEDEC

The TED-Ed platform provides a framework to quickly and easily create an educational lesson around a TED Talk, TEDEd Lesson or YouTube video.

Educators can then distribute these lessons, publicly or privately, and track their impact on a group/class or an individual learner. Educators can create discussions for their classes, or customized questions to reinforce learning.

TedEd hosts a large amount of existing educational material, where users can search for the desired topics with the search function.

- Some people may find it difficult to generate their own visually attractive presentation content.
- In order to create a lesson around a video, it need to be previously updated to YouTube as well as listed as public.







Edpuzzle is an interactive video and formative assessment tool that lets users crop existing online videos and add content to target specific learning objectives.

Teachers can search the extensive library or upload their own videos to customize them with voice-overs, audio comments, embedded assessment questions, and additional resources.

There are also options to choose from the site's curriculum content. Users can assign due dates, and even prohibit students from fast-forwarding through videos.

Pros for edpuzzle:

- The basic plan is free, and it offers unlimited space for 20 videos.
- It is generated by teachers for teachers, encouraging successful learning techniques
- Educators and trainers can add their own voiceovers and audio notes to existing educational videos already online

Cons for edpuzzle:

- The quality of the learning is highly dependent upon quality content of the original material.
- Currently EDPuzzles' users are more education based, however this
 is expanding and is applicable to many other sectors.



Presentation and **Animation Tools**

Presentation and Animation to bring learning to life!

Presentation and Animation tools use the power of visual storytelling to present and animate ideas and concepts through the use of text, video and graphics. Some reasearch has suggested that video animation can increase the understaning of complex topics, as well as improve learning retention.





PowToon is a tool that enables its user to create visual and engaging videos and presentations in the form of animation. With a short learning curve, PowToon allows users to create a diverse and visually impacting video animation.

PowToon can be used by both a teacher or a learner- the teacher could create an educational video displaying certain information, or the student could create an animated video highlighting what they have learnt.

Pros for PowToon

- Excellent for creating engaging presentations and animated videos
- Easily adapts to the user's style of content creation
- Users can add their own graphics for a personalised approach

Cons for PowToon:

- Very limited app, it is recommended to use the Desktop version of PowToons
- Some users find the tool quite complex and requires a bit of a learning curve
- Free version leaves a PowToon watermark and a short clip at the end of videos

Kahoot! is a free game-based system which offers an engaging way to test the learning and knowledge of learners and audience. Kahoot! makes learning new topics interactive and fun, it encourages engagement even from adult learners! Kahoot! can be adapted to a wide variety of subjects and languages.

Kahoot! Also has a record of success in classrooms, <u>according to their own blog post</u> 70% of Kahoot! Users have increased final grades, and Kahoot! Has a "positive effect on learning performance, classroom dynamics, attitudes, and anxiety".

- Requires a strong internet connection if several users are connected



Thinglink is a tool that allows educators and students embed audio, video and rich media links directly in images and share them across the web, and is simple to operate. Thinglink encourages interactive thinking and collaboration. In a classroom setting it can be easily incorporated into group work.

Thinglink can be used by teachers or students to designate parts of sites or pages with pictures and videos that will produce a pop-up with a description and/or a link to something else on the web when they are scrolled over. Users can make static images interactive which can make learning more engaging.

Research and Curation Tools can save you time and energy!

Research and Curation tools offer knowledge sharing solutions and a social platform for interactions and discussions. This can help reduce the amount of time taken to research information about a topic, or can help to clarify complex topics, as well as improve learning retention.



Kesearch



Diigo is a social bookmarking website that allows signedup users to bookmark and tag Web pages. Additionally, it allows users to highlight any part of a webpage and attach sticky notes to specific highlights or to a whole page. The name "Diigo" is an acronym from "Digest of Internet Information, Groups and Other stuff".

These annotations can be kept private, shared with a group within Diigo, or be forwarded to someone else via a special link.

Diigo can very effectively be used to help students learn how to manage online content using the various Diigo features.

- Users can have online coversations within the context of the materials themselves

Cons for Diigo:

- Requires connection to the internet
- Some users report having issues with PDFs where they cannot be stored offline on the app
- Some users claim the platform is a bit confusing



Research Curtation



Padlet is an online noticeboard, which can be used for making announcements, keeping notes and online brainstorming. Notes can contain links, videos, images or document files. When registered with Padlet, one can create as many "walls" or online notice boards as needed.

As a creator of a wall, teachers can moderate all notes before they appear, and privacy settings can be adjusted at any time. Padlet is great for group research, as it allows students to share their ideas with each other encouraging creativity. Using it in a classroom setting, teachers can facilitate greater participation and motivate students to be creative.



Webinar Meeting Tools

Webinar and Online Meetings – a key part of education delivery now and in future

Within the current Pandemic, tools that allow people to meet and work with each other without being in the same room is exceptionally important. There are many ways to provide remote lessons, as well as improving course content and structure through the use of these digital tools.





Zoom is a video-chatting tool. You can use it to hold online classes, visit virtually with friends and relatives, and even join remote events like birthday parties. For teachers, the free version of Zoom provides a suite of useful features. This includes the ability to host meetings with up to 100 participants, and to allow students to wordlessly signal to the teacher that they have a question.

Users can also brainstorm on a virtual white board and collaborate on projects by annotating documents on other students' screens.

- Free version is limited to a 40-minute session when more than 2 people are in the group
- Education version can be expensive

S Skype

Skype is a tool that enables the user to have one-on-one or group conversations and works on a variety of different platforms. Skype can be used to communicate via message, voice or video call. It can also be used as a file sharing tool, or share your screen and can be used to send pictures.

Skype Translator is also a built-in tool for skype that allows real time language translation allowing you to speak with anyone in the world!

Educators can use Skype in several different ways, they may want to create a presentation or lesson and stream it over Skype, or they may want their students to host a Skype call to showcase their learning.



Webinar and

Cisco Webex

Webex is an online tool that enables users to have online conversations with 1-100 participants (depending on the plan the person hosting the meeting is on) It can be used on many platforms, and is easy to understand and start using.

Webex can be used primarily to communicate via voice or video call. It can also be used as a file sharing tool. Similarly, users can share their screen and can be used to send pictures and other documents.

Webex offers a secure service, where rooms can be locked with a password. Webex is considered an inclusive software, offering equal experiences for everyone regardless of geography, language, or communication style.

Filesharing tools allow the user to transfer digital files to one or more other users. They can be used in several different ways, sometimes to share files such as course materials. Filesharing also enables users to access any of the files they have uploaded at any point ensuring that they have internet access. Get rid of those USB





Dropbox is a tool that allows the user to store and sync documents and files across many different devices. Dropbox is a well-implemented, cloud-based, automatic, file-syncing service that has an excellent array of apps for various operating systems. Installation is simple, and once installed get instant access to all your files as long as you are connected to the internet.

Using Dropbox as an educator is very useful as a tool for managing your own material and making it more accessible. It is very useful for students working in a group as it makes file sharing and collaborating very easy.

WeTransfer eliminates this by making it easy to send files to one or more people. Send photos, PDF files, videos, or any other large file to colleagues easily.



Slack is a powerful communication tool, enabling project planning and team collaboration. It provides a platform for communication between a large team or classroom of individuals using channels.

- Centrally organize project information, schedules, tasks, resources, and communication into an accessible workspace

Cons for Monday:

- Pricing is on a per user basis, adding more users with full permissions will cost more
- Some users can initially find Monday confusing or too cluttered
- The mobile app offers limited functionality

- Ideal for smaller teams, but not the best option for larger teams
- Some functionality improves for the paid version, such as increased upload file size




Conclusions
